OLD POWAY PARK

When retired Army Colonel John S. Porter settled in Poway in 1948, he had a dream — revitalize Old Poway and make it a place for folks to come and enjoy the old west. Through the years, Colonel Porter acquired and built the beginnings of a historic village. Included in his dream was the purchase of a 1907 Bladwin No.3 Steam Engine and a half-mile of track. “The Poway Village & Rattlesnake Creek Railroad” operated during the sixties for special events like the Fourth of July and Pow Wow Days. When Colonel Porter died in 1979 he had completely fulfilled his dream of a fully operating historic village.

In 1986, the City of Poway purchased the 4.75 acre Porter estate and “Old Cantankerous”, the Baldwin Steam Engine and its rail. The City undertook the completion of Colonel Porter’s dream and built Old Poway Park.

Historic buildings from around Poway were brought to the site and restored. Included are Poway’s first assembly hall, the incorporated Order of Good Templar’s Hall, and the Nelson House. The two existing buildings, the Porter House and the Hamburger Factory, were refurbished. A train barn was built to house the steam engine, a 1938 Fairmont Speeder, ore car, and a 1894 L.A. Yellow Trolley. The Overshiner’s blacksmith shop and the gazebo were built to enhance the ambiance of the turn-of-the-century setting. A two-acre green park for picnics was styled after the Teddy Roosevelt National Park system. The park was officially opened in July 1993.

Old Poway Park is owned and maintained by the City of Poway. The Old Poway Park Action Committee (OPPAC) plans and operates its special events and weekly activities.

OLD POWAY PARK (continued)

The Action Committee ensures the authenticity of the park's activities to historic accuracy with the help of the volunteer guilds representing various aspects of early 1900's life. Guild members include the Poway-Midland Railroad Volunteers, who operate and maintain the park's rolling stock; The Poway Historical and Memorial Society, who operate the Heritage Museum and Nelson House; the Poway Arts and Crafts Guild, who demonstrates authentic turn-of-the-century craft and trades; and Poway Historical Plays are dedicated to re-enacting local history. Other groups are the Poway Artists' League, the Poway Iron Group, The Heritage Dancers, and the Pomerado Community Band. Over 400 dedicated volunteers give generously of their time to recreate and preserve Poway History.

Special events held at Old Poway Park during the year include: An old-fashioned Fourth of July, Christmas in the Park, music festivals,

and various shows and displays. Regular weekend activities include a farmer's market on Saturday mornings, train rides, arts & crafts markets and tours through the Heritage Museum and Nelson House. The City of Poway Community Services Department offers recreational classes during the week. Templar's Hall, Porter House, and the Gazebo can be reserved for weddings, meetings, and parties. The green park area is available to the public for picnics on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Old Poway Park is staffed by a Recreational Interpretive Specialist who assists the various guilds in their mission to make local history come alive. The park office is located in the Porter House.

Old Poway Park is a dream come true. As Colonel Porter's wife has said, "What the City has done to the property was exactly what my husband had planned."

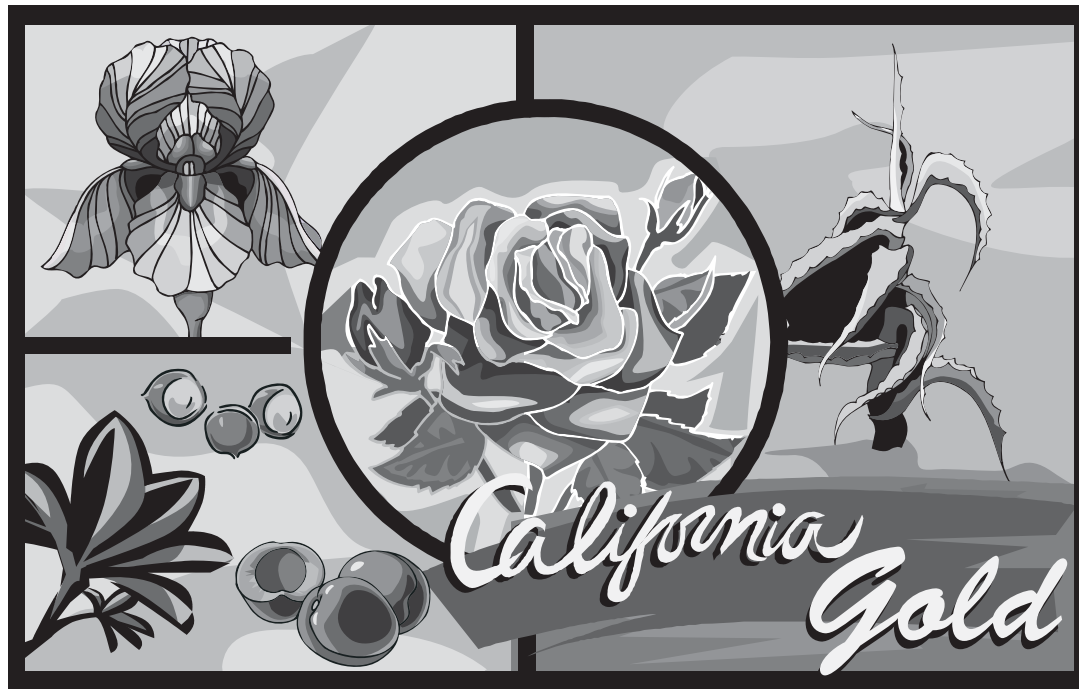
FLOWER SHOW GENERAL RULES

1. This is a Standard Flower Show and conforms to the standards and objectives established by the National Garden Clubs, Inc. Rules are in compliance with the Handbook for Flower Shows, 2007 (revised). The Standard System of Awarding will be used in judging exhibits: one 1st (blue ribbon) scoring 90 points or more, one 2nd (red) scoring 85 points or more, and one 3rd (yellow) scoring 80 points or more may be awarded in each class, if merited. More than one Honorable Mention (white) scoring 75 points or more may be awarded.
2. Judges are accredited by National Garden Clubs, Inc., and their decisions are final.
3. Competition is open to any amateur gardener or flower arranger. Entries by non-members of the club are encouraged.
4. Entries will be received on Thursday, April 23, between 5:00p.m. and 8:00p.m., and on Friday, April 24, between 7:30a.m. and 9:00a.m. All exhibitors must complete entry cards (available from the Entries Chair) before exhibits can be placed. The Classification Chair will check entries for conformance to the schedule before referring to the Placement Committee. The judging area must be cleared by 10:00a.m. on Friday. Judging commences at 10:30a.m.
5. No exhibits or ribbons may be removed before 3:00p.m. Saturday, and all must be removed by 3:30p.m.
6. All personal property must be identified on the bottom of container. Poway Valley Garden Club and the City of Poway will not be responsible for damage or loss of property, nor for injury to person(s), but will exercise due care for the protection of all exhibits.
7. NGCI Top Exhibitor Awards may be given if all requirements are met. See Design and Horticulture rules for requirements and scale of points for the Top Exhibitor Awards.
8. This Schedule is the law of the show. All entries must conform to it.

HORTICULTURE RULES

1. Flower Show General Rules apply.
2. All plant material must be fresh and must have been grown by the exhibitor; container-grown plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least 90 days. Only one plant per container is allowed unless otherwise specified.
3. Exhibitors are limited one (1) entry in each class or sub-class.
4. Exhibitors must supply their own clear glass bottles that have no distracting markings. Exhibits should not have any foliage below the water line. Wedging material to keep exhibits upright is permitted.
5. No substance (spray, oil, dye, etc.) may be applied to enhance the plant's natural shine or color.
6. Length of cut branches of trees and shrubs is 12"-30" from tip of specimen to cut end.
7. Classification consultants will be available to help in determining Class or Sub-class for entries.
8. Classes may be subdivided at the discretion of the Classification Committee.
9. Plants on the State Conservation List must be grown by the exhibitor or obtained in a legal manner, and so marked.
10. Double potting of container plants is permitted. Top dressing on succulents is permitted.

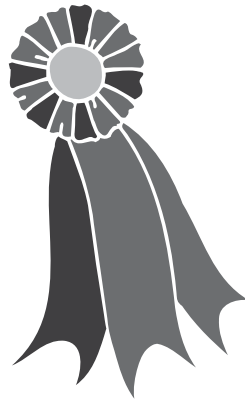

TOP NATIONAL HORTICULTURE AWARDS

Award of Horticultural Excellence — This award may be given to the exhibit judged as the finest in the entire Horticulture Division. The winner must be a properly named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or higher. It is represented by a rosette of green, orange and blue ribbons.

Award of Merit — This is a section award, which may be presented to properly named blue ribbon winners scoring 95 points or more. It is represented by a rosette of orange ribbons and may be awarded in each.

Arboreal Award — This is an award which may be presented to a properly named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or more in Section D. It is represented by a rosette or two values of green ribbons.

TOP NATIONAL HORTICULTURE AWARDS (cont.)

Sweepstakes Award — This may be awarded to the exhibitor receiving the most blue ribbons in the Horticulture Division. In the event of a tie, red ribbons will be counted. It is represented by a rosette of green and white ribbons.

Mary Sokach Memorial Award —
This award is available to Poway Valley Garden Club members only. It is for Section A — Best Rose in Show.

Century 21-Tres Ranchos “Perpetual” Horticulture Trophy — This is an award available to Poway Valley Garden Club members only for receiving the most blue ribbons in the Horticulture Division.

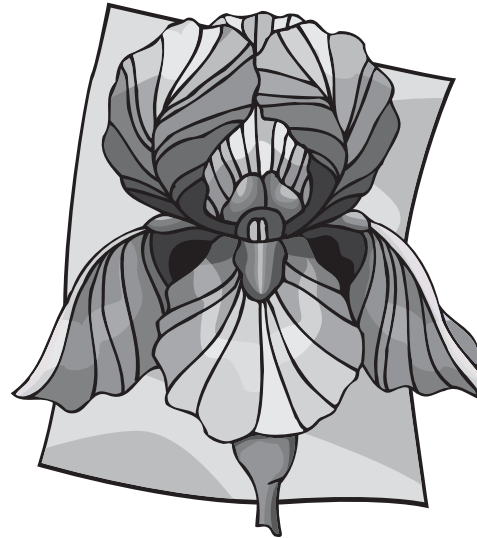

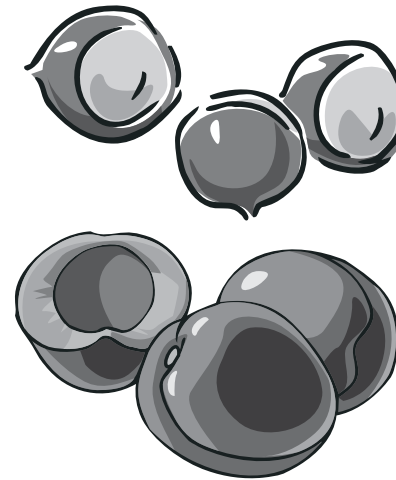

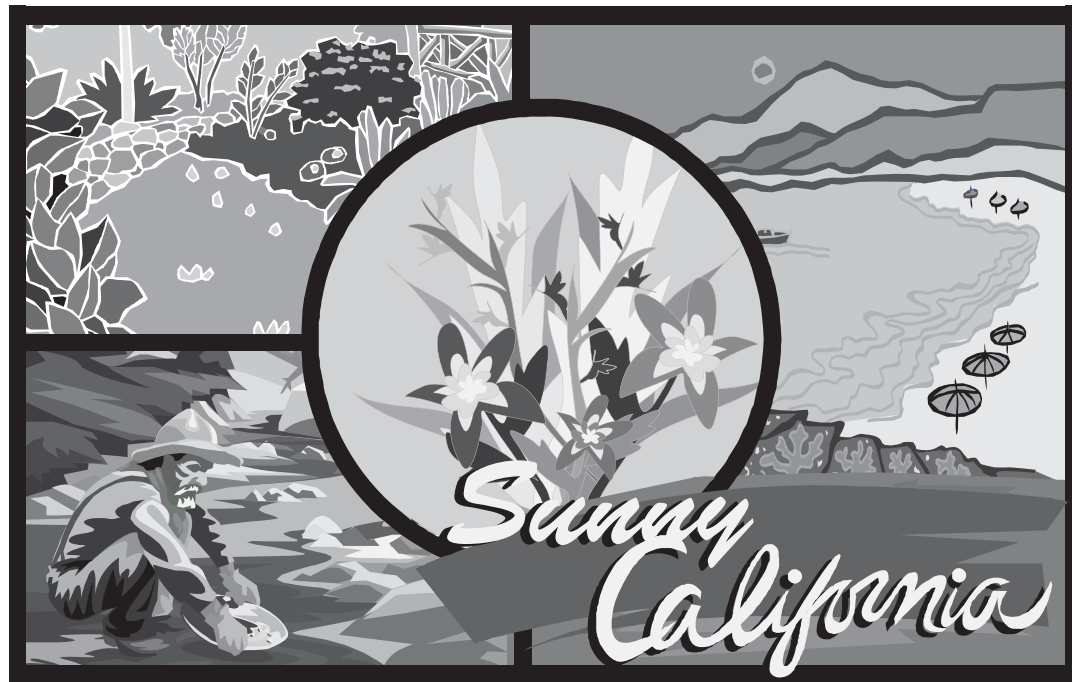

DESIGN RULES

1. Flower Show General Rules apply.
2. Plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
3. Only one entry is permitted by an exhibitor in each class.
4. Reservations are required for all classes; deadline is April 3, 2009. Call Design Chair, Peggy Daubert at 858-780-9919.
5. All designs must contain some plant material. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted. Fresh plant material may not ever be treated in any manner. Dried or glycerinized plant material or contrived flowers made from recognizable plant material are permitted, except where prohibited by the schedule. Cut fruit or vegetables must be properly sealed.
6. Drapes and/or underlays are permitted in all classes. Accessories are permitted; however, religious symbols used must be displayed in a respectful manner and in accordance with policies of local religious organizations. American and other national flags must be displayed in accordance with proper flag etiquette.
7. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted. Class titles are intended to stimulate the imagination, but should not be taken literally.
8. Exhibitors are requested to list plant material on a 3 x 5 card.
9. Please phone Design Chair, Peggy Daubert at 858-780-9919, with any questions.
10. **The Design Chair must be notified if an exhibitor is unable to participate.**

Petite Award — This award may be given in Section B to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or higher. Size and plant material must conform to the requirements listed in the schedule. It is represented by a small rosette of blue and white ribbons.

Designer's Choice Award — This award may be given in Section C to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or higher. Designer has complete freedom in choice of plant material and components. It is represented by a rosette of purple ribbons.

Sweepstakes Award — This may be awarded to the exhibitor receiving the most blue ribbons in the Design Division. In the event of a tie, red ribbons will be counted. It is represented by a rosette of green and white ribbons.

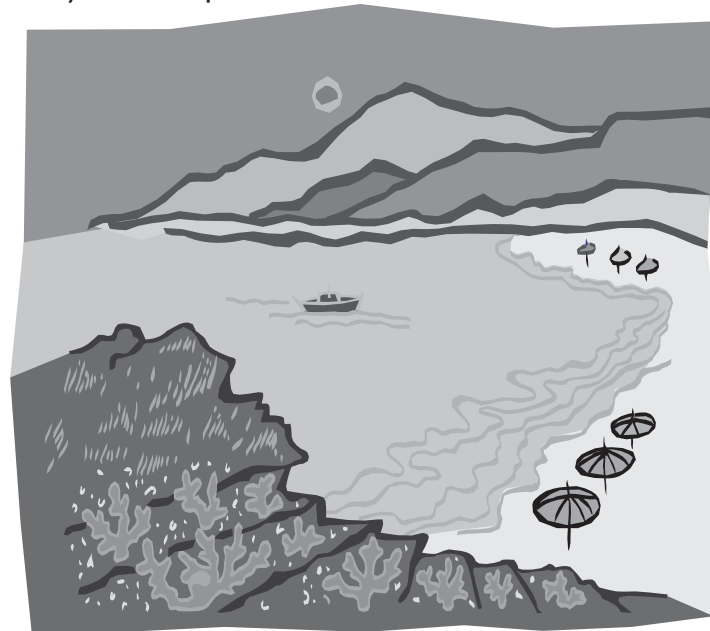
